
Greywolf Families,

Thank you for following our drop-off and pick-up routes by taking Joslin or Mill Roads to Runnion Rd, then traveling South on Carlsborg. Hopefully you are noticing improvements in the pick-up time with each passing day as families learn our systems, and we look for ways to adjust so things run more efficiently. Our kindergarten students are dismissed first at 2:55pm, so if you use our looper lane to pick up a kindergartener, come a bit early. All other loopers are dismissed after that, so if you are a family of a first or second grader and you have arrived to the looper lane early, we will ask you to loop around while kindergarteners load up and go.

This week had a few other firsts! We had our first fire drill and our first assembly for our 1st and 2nd graders! Our assembly was a time to help students learn and practice assembly behavior expectations and they did such an amazing job! We have weekly assemblies with special guests such as members of the Port Angeles Symphony, the high school band and choir, plays, and much more! We had a successful alarm drill on Wednesday, September 13.


