

Feeding Youth of the Olympic Peninsula

Ensuring children have access to nutritious meals and snacks when school is not in session.

The Summer Food Service Program (SFSP) is a federally-funded, state-administered program. SFSP reimburses program operators who serve free healthy meals and snacks to children and teens in low-income areas.

Students in our community are counting down the days until summer. Freedom from school schedules is on the horizon for them and they are already making plans of how they will enjoy their time off. Summer brings joy for a lot of us as we get longer days and more sunshine, but for many, this season of joy is shrouded with hardship.

Children across the Olympic Peninsula qualifying for free or reduced-price lunch, lose access to nutritious meals during the summer with the closure of their school districts. This gap in meal provision has led to summer being a time of food insecurity and hunger for our youth, and this hardship is one that the USDA Summer Food Program strives to eradicate by offering free summer meals to all children under the age of 18.

Through the Boys & Girls Clubs community volunteers and youth interns, access to summer meals will once again be provided in Port Angeles and Sequim. Summer Meals can be accessed at a total of 10 locations across the Peninsula including the Boys & Girls Clubs, parks, housing complexes, and school sites.
